Proper documentation can go a long way in avoiding unnecessary headaches that could arise during a tax audit. Similarly, being adequately prepared for oral interviews can make the rest of an audit proceed more smoothly. However, more often than not people get busy, things get missed, and documentation evidencing legal relationships and transactions is not always available or adequate. Interviews may take place without sufficient preparation, which could lead auditors to draw conclusions or take positions that are markedly different than reality. Using practical examples, this session aims to give actionable tips on how to set your company up for success for future audits, as well as strategies on how to navigate situations where documentation may be lacking, incomplete, or inadequate.
